



**Bill Quirk, Council Member
City of Hayward
Board of Directors
Bay Area Water Supply & Conservation Agency**

Bill Quirk was appointed by the City of Hayward to the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency in September 2007. The city provides water to a population of approximately 150,000 residents.

Dr. Quirk was elected to Hayward's City Council in 2004, and reelected in March 2008. He serves as the Liaison to the Library Commission and Literacy Council. Dr. Quirk is a member of the Council's Budget Committee, Airport Committee, Sustainability Committee, and Technology Advisory Committee. Dr. Quirk currently serves as Deputy Chair of the BAWSCA Policy Committee. He is a member of the Hayward Area Shoreline Planning Agency, and Local Agencies Committee which includes the City, Schools and Recreation District in Hayward.

Prior to his election to the city council, Dr. Quirk was heavily involved in the reform of the County Board of Education in 2002 and 2004, and the Hayward School Board in 1993. Dr. Quirk was awarded with the Friend of Education Award by the School Administrators of Hayward for revitalizing participation in Hayward Parent Teacher Associations in 1992 through 1998.

He co-led the effort to refurbish and expand Weekes Branch Library by communicating to the City Council the need for the expansion and helping raise \$250,000 in additional funds to finish the effort. Dr. Quirk earned his Ph.D. in Astrophysics from Columbia University, and his B.S from Columbia University Engineering School. He grew up in Newton, Massachusetts, and has been a resident of the Hayward area since 1978.
