Jamie McLeod was appointed by the City of Santa Clara to the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency in 2011. The city provides water from the San Francisco regional water system to commercial/industrial customers in its northern area and to residents in the southern area. The city owns and operates its own water utility.

McLeod was elected to the Santa Clara City Council in 2004 and re-elected in 2008, serving as Vice-Mayor in 2005. McLeod serves the city as Agency Member of the Redevelopment Agency, Authority Member of the Sports & Open Space Authority, Authority Member of the Industrial Development Authority, Authority Member of the Joint Financing Authority, Board Member of the Santa Clara Stadium Authority, and Commissioner of the Housing Authority. McLeod also serves as Chair of the Ethics Committee, Chair of the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Committee, as Member of the Audit Committee, and Council Goal Setting Committee.

Regionally, McLeod serves as the Chair of the Santa Clara County Recycling and Waste Reduction Commission, Vice-Chair of the San Jose/Santa Clara Clean Water Financing Authority, as well as Alternate on the Northern California Power Agency (NCPA), San Jose/Santa Clara Treatment Plant Advisory Committee (TPAC), Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (SCVTA) Policy Advisory Committee, and South Bay Dischargers Authority. She is a Board Member of Sustainable Silicon Valley and the San Francisco Bay Area Regional Water System Financing Authority (RFA).

Her experience includes organizational effectiveness and capacity building for local government and non-profits, community dispute mediation, repair of schools in Bosnia and Kosovo, water system monitoring in India, and assisting refugees attain self-sufficiency.
