



**John H. Weed, Director
Alameda County Water District
Board of Directors
Bay Area Water Supply & Conservation Agency**

John H. Weed was appointed by the Alameda County Water District to the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency. The district supplies water to over 75,000 customers in the cities of Fremont, Newark and Union City.

Weed has served as a director for the Alameda County Water District since 1995. He has served as a council member representing Region V of the Association of California Water Agencies since 1998. Since 1997, Weed has served as Commissioner of the Utility Services Agency of the Association of California Water Agencies. Since 1977, he has served on the Board of Trustees of the Ohlone Community College District.

Weed is an attorney at law with a practice in Fremont. He was formerly the Special Assistant to the Division Manager, Ordnance Engineering Division, FMC Corporation in San Jose. He was a Graduate Research Associate in the Department of Agricultural Economics of the University of Arizona in Tucson. Weed was also an Engineer-Technician in the Planning Division of the Santa Clara County Water District.

In 2000, Weed retired with the rank of Colonel, Civil Engineering Officer, United States Air Force Reserve. From 1969 to 1972, Weed served on active duty in the U.S. Air Force as an Explosive Ordnance Disposal Officer and Munitions Maintenance Officer.

His civic activities have included serving as a member of the Heritage Task Force, State of California; chair of the Historical Architectural Review Board, City of Fremont; member of the Regulatory Reform Committee, City of Fremont; chair of the Alameda County-City of Fremont Library Study Committee; and as President of the Washington Township Historical Society.

He holds a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Santa Clara. Weed earned a master of business administration degree in Finance from Eastern New Mexico University, and a bachelor of science degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Santa Clara. He was a graduate student in the Department of Water Resources Administration at the University of Arizona. He is a member of the State Bar of California.
