



**Margaret (Marty) Laporte, Associate Director  
Stanford University, Utilities Services

Marty Laporte is an employee of Stanford University and was appointed by the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors to the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency. Laporte is Associate Director of Utilities for Environmental Quality and Water Conservation in Stanford University's Department of Sustainability and Energy Management.

Ms. Laporte has been with the university for more than 17 years. She co-authored Stanford's Water Conservation, Reuse, and Recycling Master Plan, and since 2001, developed the water efficiency program. Under her leadership, Stanford University's Water Conservation Program was awarded the first 2009 Silicon Valley Water Conservation Award in the category of large organizations. She also developed and manages the Environmental Programs for Stanford University, including soils, domestic water, sewer, storm water, groundwater, and surface water compliance. From 1997 to 2002, she initiated and chaired the Water Quality Committee for the Bay Area Water Users Association (predecessor to BAWSCA). Since 2007, she has been the Vice-Chair for the BAWSCA Technical Advisory Committee.

Ms. Laporte has published a variety of professional papers and has been invited to speak to diverse professional groups on topics that include water efficiency, data management for water conservation programs, project management, and California geology. She holds a Master of Science degree in Geology from San Jose State University and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology and Environmental studies from University of California at Santa Cruz.
